

TORONTO, ON – June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021 – In February, the Canadian Tire Corporation announced an additional \$12 million commitment to Jumpstart's Sport Relief Fund to help sport and recreation organizations build back sport and play in Canada.

In mid-April, the Ontario Lacrosse Association (OLA) received confirmation that it had been named amongst over 700 sports and recreation organizations throughout Canada to be provided with grant support through Jumpstart's Sport Relief Funding in the first round of applications. "Jumpstart's funding of minor lacrosse organizations throughout Ontario means that our clubs will be able to continue to offer quality programs and services to their communities. It is our hope that even more of our clubs, upon seeing this news, will considering applying for funding through Jumpstart's Sport Relief Funding Program to assist their recovery and return."

The final funding window for the 2021 JumpStart program is open between now and August 1, 2021 for programs taking place between September 1 and December 31. OLA clubs may consider applying for planned Return to Activity and/or fall field lacrosse activities to cover eligible costs, which include:

- payment of past due/overdue accounts
- strategies to develop fundraising/revenue generation
- operational efficiencies (to execute Return to Activity programs)
- program delivery adaptations (including Return to Activity game modifications)
- start-up expenses related to establishing online programming
- · facility and equipment costs
- costs incurred to meet Return to Activity guidelines/provincial health protocols/regulations (including PPE, cleaning supplies, individual safety equipment for participants, etc.)
- transportation costs
